LOCAL RULES

1. ENTRY DEADLINES:

Large Animal Market Entries must be submitted by Friday, April 18, 2025 at 11:59 PM.

Small Animal Market, Prospect, Breeding & Showmanship Entries must be submitted by Friday, May 16, 2025 at 11:59 PM.

Entries must be submitted through ShoWorks and all payments must be received for entries to be valid.

No late entries will be accepted.

Market Animal Declaration must be made prior to weigh in on Tuesday, June 17, 2025.

2. ELIGIBILITY: Only exhibitors eligible to show in the Junior Livestock Department may show animals. See Junior Livestock Rules & Eligibility on page 8 & 9.

- a) Juniors, who for extraordinary reasons (emergency situations), cannot show their own animals must make arrangements for their care and showing that are acceptable to Fair Management or will be subject to disqualification (fines may apply). Fair management must be immediately notified in such a case for consideration.
- b) No entry fees will be returned in the event of a disqualification.

3. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: Exhibitors **MUST** upload the following to ShoWorks with their entries: Livestock Exhibitor Contract, Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct Contract, YQCA Certificate (not required for Pee Wee), Bill of Sale (market & prospect animals only), and Prop 12 Certificate (market & prospect hog exhibitors only). The BILL OF SALE and/or Yellow Slip (for cattle) must show the date of purchase, exhibitor's name, and the seller's name.

- a) **The following documents are required to be completed and received as an original copy to the FAIR OFFICE by Friday, May, 30, 2025: Livestock Exhibitor Contract, Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct Contract, Liability Waiver and First Aid Form.**
- b) All cattle will need a Yellow Slip upon entry to the fairgrounds.
- c) If an exhibitor is found to be falsifying documents they will be disqualified, and will not be eligible to compete at any level at the 2026 Redwood Acres Fair.

4. YQCA CERTIFICATE: Must be submitted with entries. Certificates must be valid through the last day of the fair.

5. PROP 12 COMPLIANCE: Exhibitors entering a market or prospect hog will be required to provide proof of Prop 12 Certification with its watermark from their breeder/seller at time of entry. The original certificate WILL BE required on the day of weigh-in, no exceptions will be made. Quality control marking will be checked. If an exhibitor's animal has not been purchased from a certified breeder OR if the original certificate is not provided, they will be disqualified.

6. **ANIMAL ENTRY CLARIFICATION:**

- a) Market - animal intended for sale at the Sale of Excellence.
- b) Prospect - feeder animal not intended for sale at the Sale of Excellence. Prospect animals must be weighed in and are not eligible to be sold in the Sale of Excellence. No class changes will be permitted to a market division.
- c) Breeding - animals must qualify for an available breeding class and may not be exhibited in Market or Prospect. Animals must be shown in their respective breed class to be eligible to participate in a group class. ALL breeding animals must be vet checked (by 2 PM) and checked in with the Livestock Office by 5 PM Tuesday, June 17, 2025. Animals stalled without a vet check will be disqualified and failure to check in breeding animals may result in disqualification of animals not checked in.
- d) Large Animals are: Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle (none for 2025), Meat Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep and Swine.
- e) Small Animals are: Pygmy Goats, Rabbits, Cavy and Poultry.
- f) An animal must be exhibited in a market, prospect or breeding class in order to be eligible to participate in showmanship (Pee Wee Showmanship is an exception).
- g) Pee Wee exhibitors are not required to own an animal, but the exhibitor must be able to safely and comfortably handle the animal.
- h) Companion animals are not permitted, unless arranged with the Livestock Superintendent.

7. **ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION:** All animals entered must be marked with a form of identification: notch, tag, tattoo or brand. Actual tattoos and tags/or brands must correspond with what is stated in entries. They will be checked at the scale, check-in or vet check.

8. **VET CHECK:** All animals, including breeding and small animals, must be vet checked prior to unloading and stalling. Animals not vet checked by the designated fair vet will be disqualified.

9. **WEIGH-IN:** All market and prospect animals must be weighed at their scheduled time. See page 11 for details. **Only one weight per animal** per exhibitor will be accepted, all weights are considered official at the time of weigh in. All animals will be weighed dry and sheep and goats must be sheared and/or clipped prior to weigh-in. See each species department for minimum weights.

10. **MARKET ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY:**

- a) Exhibitors may enter up to two market animals in a division and may enter market animals in up to two different market divisions. Only one market animal may be shown in a division and the animal must be declared prior to weighing in. Only ONE market animal per division will be weighed per exhibitor.
- b) Market animals must meet the minimum weights per species: Market Beef - 1050 lbs; Market Goat - 60 lbs; Market Lamb - 100 lbs; Market Hog - 200 lbs; Market Rabbits - 3.5 to 5.5 pounds max each (3).
- c) Market animals weighed and those animals not meeting the minimum weight will be transferred to the respective Prospect Class.

11. **MARKET ANIMAL TAGGING:** All market animals will be tagged. This tag will be specific to the animal entered. This tag is not removable after placement. **If any exhibitor is caught removing, switching, or changing tags FOR ANY reason not approved or supervised by the Livestock Superintendent, exhibitors will be disqualified and asked to leave the fairgrounds immediately.** Exhibitors in violation will forfeit their right to participate in future Redwood Acres Fair Livestock Shows and Livestock Sales.

12. EXHIBITOR CONDUCT: Exhibitors are expected to abide by all fairground, local and state rules. At no time will Junior exhibitors have any illegal substance in their possession or be under the influence of the same. Junior exhibitors will use discretion in conduct at all times. Loud and abusive language will not be tolerated at any time. Youth exhibitors are expected to drive safely or lose the privilege of driving on grounds. Violations of this rule will be subject to disqualification from show(s)/auction and removal from fairgrounds.

13. SUPERVISION: All Junior exhibitors MUST have “On Grounds” supervision by a responsible adult over the age 21.

14. JUDGING: The American Judging System will be used with the exception of Pee Wee. Exhibitors will be responsible for getting their animals in the show ring on time when class is called or forfeit their right to exhibit.

15. UNIFORM: The required dress for the fair is the traditional white pants, and white shirt. You may not show unless in uniform with the exception of the traditional Grange attire.

16. ETIQUETTE FOR SPECTATORS: Spectators are not allowed to engage in conversation with the judge while they are judging or exhibitors while they are showing. If warned and it continues, the spectators will be banned from the remainder of the show. This applies to both large and small animal shows.

17. FAIR NOT LIABLE FOR THEFT: The Fair WILL NOT be responsible for any thefts but will use every precaution available to ensure safety of all exhibits and personal items, and will not be held accountable for loss or damage, regardless of the cause or extent.

18. ADA: If any special ADA requirements are needed by any exhibitor or fair patron, please contact the Fair Office or Livestock Superintendent for accommodations.

19. ADMISSION & CREDENTIAL: Passes/packets will be available at the Livestock Office as follows:

- a) **WRIST BANDS:** Each exhibitor will get 2 wrist bands. Up to 3 additional wristbands may be purchased at the livestock office for \$10 each on entry day.
- b) **CAMPING:** LIMITED Spaces are available for livestock exhibitor families with self-contained trailers, RVs or tents at \$110.00 per space. There are limited water hook-ups available. It is advisable to reserve camping spaces early. Camping spaces may be purchased on ShoWorks. All camping reservations are due no later than the last entry date: Friday, May 16, 2025.
 - 1) The Acres is not responsible for damages or theft while campers/tents/RVs are on the grounds or in the parking lots. The Ninth District Agricultural Association assumes no responsibility for those staying on the grounds.
 - 2) Junior exhibitors who have written permission from parents on file in the Fair Manager's office may stay in the livestock designated camping area in campers or in trailers, if accompanied by an adult. Each camper or trailer that houses Junior exhibitors must have an adult chaperone over 21 years of age who is directly responsible for the Juniors. At no time will small children be left unattended in trailers and campers.

- c) **PARKING PASSES:** There are only two types of parking at the fair.
- 1) On grounds parking passes are available 1 per camping family.
 - 2) Off-grounds parking passes are \$5 per vehicle per day, and they are paid at the gate each day.
 - 3) Parking Passes for lot C will be for sale at the check in table during the weigh in times \$40.00 each. There will be preferential parking for disabled persons with proper placards.

20. **PARKING:** Vehicles must be parked in designated parking lots only for the safety of exhibitors, fair-goers and livestock. Owners of vehicles who do not have a trailer camping pass must have their vehicles off the grounds by 9 AM daily. If you are not moved by 9 AM, and your vehicle does not display a Parking Pass on your dash, your vehicle will be towed at your expense, **NO EXCEPTIONS**. **Parking passes will be sold outside the Livestock Office during weigh in times only.**

21. **MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION:** Electric scooters, bikes, golf carts and other modes of motorized transportation ARE NOT permitted on the fairgrounds for any reason.

22. **STOCK TRAILERS:** Must be parked in the designated area. Trailers not parked in designated areas will be towed at the owner's expense.

23. **BARN RULES:** NO FOOD OR DRINKS ALLOWED IN BARN AREA. All Junior exhibitors must be out of the livestock area each night by 10:00 PM, with the exception of those exhibitors directly caring for animals and having written permission of the Livestock Superintendent.

24. **FEED & BEDDING:** Exhibitors in all livestock departments must furnish their own feed for animals. The Fair will furnish the first bedding only. **ONLY** shavings are approved for use in pens and stalls.

25. **ANIMAL/PEN CLEANLINESS:** ALL exhibitors will at all times give the necessary attention to their exhibit(s). In all Livestock Departments, exhibitors must keep their animals clean and in show condition. Stalls and pens must be neatly kept and supplied with necessary clean bedding, feed and water at all times. Pathways must be kept clean for the convenience and safety of the spectators. Water must be turned off when not in use. **Exhibitors are required to strip and break down their animals' pens during Livestock Release on Sunday, June 22, 2025.**

26. **FITTING:** Junior exhibitors are expected to groom and care for their animal(s) when at the fair. They shall refrain from accepting active assistance from adults and non-exhibiting youth unless the junior exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is only for instruction. Violations may result in the animal in question being disqualified from the fair at the discretion of fair management.

27. **TENTS:** Pop-up tents displayed in or around the barns MAY NOT have sides. Tents must be in designated areas. NO LIVESTOCK ANIMALS are permitted in the camping area or beyond designated livestock areas.

28. **DOGS:** NO DOGS ALLOWED ON FAIRGROUNDS UNLESS THE DOG IS A PARTICIPANT OF A SANCTIONED FAIR EVENT. **THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS SERVICE DOGS.**

29. SALE OF EXCELLENCE REQUIREMENTS:

- a) **TERMINAL SALE:** Market animals are entered and shown in their respective division with the intention of selling in the Redwood Acres Sale of Excellence, with the understanding that this is a *TERMINAL SALE*.
- b) The Sale of Excellence is limited to 70 lots allocated to the following: 6 Market Beef, 15 Market Goats, 20 Market Lamb, 25 Market Hogs, and 4 pens of 3 Market Rabbits. The judge will determine market animal eligibility to participate in the Sale of Excellence.
 - 1) In the event, per the judge's determination of market ready animals, there are not enough market ready animals, the allocated sale numbers will not be met.
 - 2) In the event the maximum number of lots per species is not met, those available large animal spots *may* be filled utilizing a lottery system at the discretion of the Livestock Committee based on animals considered eligible by the judge. In the event of a Lottery Drawing, it will take place at 8:30 AM on Friday, June 20, 2025. Exhibitors and a parent/guardian must be present at the time of drawing. See page 47 for more information.
- c) Exhibitors may sell one eligible animal in the Sale of Excellence as determined by the judge based on the determined number of lots per species in the sale. If an exhibitor earns Supreme or Reserve Supreme Champion with their market animal(s) entered, they may sell the second animal if eligible to participate in the sale.
 - 1) In the event an exhibitor qualifies for the sale with two market animals but does not have a Supreme or Reserve Supreme Champion market animal, exhibitors must declare which market animal they would like to participate in the Sale of Excellence by Thursday, June 19 at 7 PM with the Livestock Superintendent.
- d) ALL Supreme or Reserve Supreme Champion market animals must sell in the Sale of Excellence.
- e) The Redwood Acres Fair Sale of Excellence requires that each market exhibitor entered in the fair, sell ONE luncheon ticket. Exhibitors failing to comply with this rule will have a \$100.00 fine taken from their sale check. Tickets must be turned in to the fair office by 6 PM on June 17, 2025.
- f) Participants are required to attend the mandatory sale meeting & set up. An absence will result in a \$100 fine.
 - 1) The Sale Order will be presented at the Mandatory Sellers Meeting.
 - 2) Exhibitors will have one hour following the adjournment of the mandatory sale meeting to correct any Sale Program (i.e. lot number, name, sale weight) discrepancies.
- g) A **10% commission** will be withheld from each animal sold & Add-On bids collected to assist in covering expenses of the Sale and Livestock Department.
- h) The pay to weight for the Sale of Excellence is: Market Beef - 1400 lbs; Market Goats - 120 lbs; Market Lamb - 150 lbs; Market Hots - 300 lbs. Pens of Market Rabbits will be sold by the lot.

30. ADVERTISEMENT: No advertising of non-sale animals in BARNs or on REDWOOD ACRES GROUNDS for the sale of any livestock animal may occur until the Sale of Excellence is over. Violations will result in exhibitors not being able to participate in the 2026 Redwood Acres Fair.

31. LIVESTOCK RELEASE: Livestock will be released Sunday, June 22, 2025 from **8 AM - 11 AM ONLY. NO RELEASES WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER 11 AM.** If an animal is removed BEFORE 8 AM or AFTER 11 AM without written permission from the Fairgrounds Management, the exhibitor will not be allowed to exhibit any animal at the 2026 Redwood Acres Fair. **Exhibitors are required to strip and break down their animals' pens during Livestock Release.**

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK RULES & ELIGIBILITY

Junior Livestock Divisions are open to Humboldt, Del Norte, and Trinity County Residents

ELIGIBILITY AND AGE REQUIREMENTS:

1. FFA members may exhibit as members as early as entering into the seventh grade, until the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school. (For example, a graduate this year is eligible until December 31 of next year.)
 - a) Students competing in this division must be regularly enrolled, FFA members, and meet requirements, rules and regulation set up by the C.A.T. A. and State FFA Association.
 - b) All entries must be from projects carried on as part of the regular agricultural program and must be owned by the student.
2. 4-H Requirements:
 - a) 4-H members exhibiting in any division must have good and regular standing in their 4-H Club and/or project group.
 - b) Novice, Junior, Intermediate, & Senior: Must be 9 years old on or before December 31, 2024 to exhibit. Exhibitors are eligible to exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
 - c) Exhibitors who are under 9 years of age on or before January 1, 2025 are eligible for Pee Wee Showmanship.
3. Grange Members must be at least 9 years old on January 1, 2025 to exhibit. They may exhibit until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 19.
 - a) Exhibitors who are under 9 years of age on or before January 1, 2025 are eligible for Pee Wee Showmanship.
4. Independent Exhibitors must be at least 9 years old by January 1, 2025 to exhibit. Exhibitors are eligible to exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
 - a) Exhibitors who are under 9 years of age on or before January 1, 2025 are eligible for Pee Wee Showmanship.
 - b) Youth may be ineligible to participate as Independent if documented disciplinary action involving their project(s) has been taken against them by 4-H, FFA or Grange organizations within 90 days (120 days for market beef) of the entry day of the fair.
5. Pee Wee Exhibitor Requirements: Any independent or organization affiliation. Must be under 9 years of age and at least 5 years of age on January 1, 2025 (in other words, too young to show 4-H, Independent or Grange at the fair).

PROJECT OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

1. Youth who have been 4-H, FFA, or Grange project members within 90 days (120 for market beef) prior to the fair are not eligible to compete in that project as Independent exhibitors or enter project(s) under a different organization.
2. Animal projects must be owned solely by and under the exhibitor's care and management and under the supervision of the organization in which the project will be shown as specified below.
 - a) Market animals: Beef - 120 consecutive days; and 60 consecutive days for swine, sheep, and goats.
 - b) All small market animals (rabbits, cavy and poultry (none live for 2025): 30 consecutive days.
 - c) Breeding and prospect (feeder) animals: 30 consecutive days.
3. Animal projects may NOT be shown by another person at ANY other show/jackpot regardless of the other shows' rules, within the animal's ownership period. The official ownership date is the date shown on the receipt of sale unless the animal was bred by the exhibitor. The days are counted prior to the opening day of the fair. Ownership must be maintained through show date(s) of the fair.
4. Pee Wee exhibitors are not required to adhere to ownership requirements, but the exhibitor must be able to safely and comfortably handle the animal.

Redwood Acres Fair Parental/Guardian Code of Conduct

The following code of conduct applies to all grounds within the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds and the camping area. The policy shall be in place for the duration of the Redwood Acres Fair & Livestock Show.

Part I: All Code of Conduct Agreement Forms must be signed by exhibitors and their parents or guardians. The Livestock Superintendent, the Redwood Acres Fair Manager Mic Moulton, or any member of the Redwood Acres Fair Association's Board of Directors shall have authority to administer consequences for violating any part of Redwood Acres Fair Local Rules (including Code of Conduct) or State Rules. Appeal of consequences for violations may be considered by a panel composed of the Redwood Acres Fair Manager; Mic Moulton and two RAF Board Members. The discretion of if the appeal will be heard shall be determined by the RAF Manager. Any requests for appeal shall be presented in writing and accompanied by a nonrefundable check of \$500.00 to the Fair Manager of the Redwood Acres Fair.

Part II: Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct:

- "Physical abuse refers to a violent behavior by one person towards another that results in substantial bodily injury. Physical abuse may include but is not limited to: "slapping, hitting, kicking, biting, choking, smothering, shoving, dragging, throwing, punching, shaking, burning, cutting or the use of corporal punishment."
- Parents must allow their child to demonstrate their own ability in showing animals.
- Direct criticism or interference with show officials is prohibited.
- Respectful Language is required in all areas.
- Possession of weapons or illegal drugs is strictly prohibited.
- Responsible alcohol use for those over 21 years of age is allowed on the Fairgrounds. Any abuse or public intoxication by a parent is prohibited. NO ALCOHOL is allowed within the camping area.
- Use of fireworks or sparklers is prohibited. Smoking or vaping is allowed only in designated areas.

Part III: Consequences for Violation of Exhibit Policies:

- Violations may result in disqualification from selling the animal at the fair, and or removal from the show.
- Violation of the Code of Conduct may lead to expulsion from the fairgrounds/camping area, and a ban from exhibiting in the following year as determined by the Livestock Superintendent and Redwood Acres Fair Manager.

By signing this Agreement, all parties agree to adhere to the Parent Code/Guardian Code of Conduct. Failure to read and submit a signed agreement causes ineligibility to show at the Fair.

The winner of the Award may not compete in this contest in the future.

LOVFALD FAMILY FFA ROUND ROBIN AWARD

The Lovfald Family monetary award will be presented to the highest scoring FFA member in the Round Robin Competition. FFA members placing 1st and 2nd in their respective Large Animal Advanced Showmanship Divisions will be eligible to compete in Round Robin. Each member will be required to show Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Swine, and Goats. Contestants are to provide their own animal for the Round Robin Competition. The winner of this Award may not compete in this contest in the future.

CARL A. JOHNSON MEMORIAL BUCKLE

The Carl A. Johnson Memorial Buckle will be presented to the highest scoring Youth Exhibitor in the Small Animal Round Robin Competition. Youth placing 1st and 2nd in their respective Small Animal Senior or Advanced Showmanship Divisions will be eligible to compete in Round Robin. Each youth will be required to show Poultry, Rabbits, Cavies and Pygmy Goats. Contestants are to provide their own showmanship animal for the Round Robin Competition. The winner of this award may not compete in this contest in the future.

CLARENCE BUGENIG MEMORIAL AWARD

Wayne Vickers, in memory of his business associate, founded the Clarence Bugenig Memorial Award administered by the Humboldt Area Foundation. The annual interest derived from an initial donation placed in trust by Mr. Vickers will be divided equally between winning 4-H and FFA livestock exhibitors in the beef cattle and sheep departments. A winner in one category is not eligible for more than one cash award per year. Winners shall be determined by the most points in the following divisions. Showmanship, Market or Prospect Beef, Market or Prospect Sheep, Breeding Beef and Sheep. The number of judged entries shall constitute the maximum number of points possible in a given class. Points will be awarded the reverse order of placing. The ninth placed individual shall receive 1 point. EXAMPLE: Placing Points: 1st (9 points), 2nd (8 Points), 3rd (7 points)

Outstanding Sportsmanship Award

A sportsmanship award should be one of the proudest awards that is received. It recounts your character, how you treat others, how you handle difficult situations, and how you live. It speaks of an exhibitor that thinks of others and makes sure that everyone feels like the fair is everyone's place. The award takes into account more than a moment or a specific time but of how someone lives and breathes sportsmanship as a way of being.

- **Displaying respect for animals.** This means exercising good animal management through proper healthcare and nutrition, as well as fair training practices. Animals deserve humane treatment in exchange for what they provide.
- **Displaying respect for opponents.** Sportsmanlike competitors recognize and appreciate a well-prepared, challenging opponent who can bring out the best in them and share that appreciation with their opponents.
- **Displaying respect for the "game."** This includes respecting and following the rules of the event. It also includes always trying one's best, using skill and training to achieve positive results and appreciating the training process.
- **Displaying respect for others.** Judges, livestock superintendent, livestock committee members, parents, leaders, and other exhibitors should be treated with respect. Lending a helping hand to others when needed is a great attribute of character that does not go unnoticed.
