6. COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. Finance:

- i. New tenant moving into office space under grandstands and someone lined up for Trinity Raw kitchen after they move out. Batting cages will most likely close by end of the year and sell equipment. Frankie's Bagel trying to sell or find a partner, they may close at the end of the year.

- ii. RAF has 3 months of savings, if cash flow remains the same and no major infrastructure disasters, we'll be solvent at least through the end of next summer, though we're still running a significant monthly deficit.

b. Grants

- i. The SB5 grant to upgrade our electrical infrastructure on the east side of the park was rejected, there will be one more round of funding.
- ii. Specialty Crop Grant: Orchard project discussion:
 - 1. Lost Coast Foods is also submitting a grant requesting funding to hire part-time help in the garden areas and professional help building and installing upgrades, as well as equipment. They plan to teach more workshops and classes, produce more foods, plants, and seeds for the community, and do more community outreach and education.
- iii. Sprint t-mobile merger, agreed to upgrade fairgrounds, Stewart applying on our behalf.

c. Facility:

- i. A&I roofing patched cow palace, \$3k, short term fix, cost of a new roof is \$200k. This building is used for paid storage and the roof is in poor shape.
- ii. Replaced 11 lights in the Covered Arena and will work away at replacing others with LED.
- iii. Ohana expansion renovation nearing completion
- iv. Infield in raceway flattened.

7. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Rodeo Arena Usage: There has been interest from the horse boarders in getting this back for their usage. The background is that it sat unused for many years, it would cost thousands of dollars to get it ready for a rodeo, and it's questionable if we could even get a rodeo. Go-Kart provides a minimum guarantee of \$3,500. Flat track motorcycle racing have contacted us recently about using it for a practice space as there isn't a suitable spot in the region, they would pay for usage if it works out.
 - i. Discussion: Rodeo ended because of insurance requirements and the cost of putting it on. Stock providers won't come to small venues like ours. The Rodeo Arena fell into disrepair over time and the Go-Kart group put in quite a bit of work and funding to create their track.
 - 1. CEO is directed to get an estimate for covering the Dressage and/or Chabot Arenas with Coverall. If horse boarding tenants would like to put together a report on how the money would be raised to convert the Rodeo Arena, the CEO will deliver it to the

Board of Directors. Until a viable alternative project arises, Outlaw Go- Kart allowed to use it and no changes will be made.

2. Public comment: paying stall fee gives tenants access to areas allowed for equestrian activities, though those areas have been whittled away. The Rodeo Arena was the only free run space available, the Chabot Arena is just for riding. Tenants would like to be able to run horses free in Chabot.

8. OLD BUSINESS

- a. Tobacco-Free Northcoast Presentation
 - i. Jay McCovery from Tobacco-Free North Coast: With such a strange year of no fair or events, been focusing on social media and radio ads. A smoke free fairground policy can have a big impact in HC, recommends progressing in steps. Having a smoke-free fairground still allows cannabis events. Three options are available: RAF is currently a no smoking-free facility except in accepted areas but we could enhance it to include vapes and other tobacco products and reduce the footprint of the smoking areas; option 2 eliminates smoking and vaping all together except for special events; option 3 could eliminate all on-site smoking, vaping, and marijuana completely.
 - ii. Discussion: grant from CA dept of public health for outreach, which provided RAF \$1,000 this year. Board directs the CEO to work with Jay on getting three options together and will submit to the board for review and possible vote at the next meeting.
- b. Fire Evacuation Covid Update: None

9. MANAGER'S REPORT

- a. Next Flea Market is 11/8, when it starts raining they are going to shift to Covered Arena and Judge's Pavilion.
- b. We need to have a discussion about fair and auction, and events next year. I'd like to work with a couple board members before next meeting. CEO is directed to reach out to public health to discuss with them.
- c. Horse Boarders are interested in having an open house, though they would like RAF to sponsor by paying for insurance. The board agrees to have RAF cover this expense, but would like the organizers to have a 50/50 and other similar fundraisers at the event to raise money to cover the cost.

Policy Options at a Glance

The model policies drafted for us are all very similar text with changes made to affect the options outlined in the chart below. Option 1 limits smoking to designated smoking areas (status quo) but updates definitions to include vaping and other tobacco products. Option 2 is the smoking and tobacco free approach with exceptions for special cannabis events. Option 3 prohibits cannabis smoking at all times, but permits other cannabis consumption in special designated areas.

Things to consider:

- The model policies are drafted to include chewing tobacco and other nicotine-laced tobacco products that do not produce smoke or aerosols (vape).
- Recommended we clearly define who will enforce the policy, and discuss penalty structure to be sure it is reasonable.
- Consider “option 4” cannabis events with no on-site consumption.

REDWOOD ACRES FAIRGROUNDS
TOBACCO-FREE POLICY

Option 1-Designated Smoking Areas

DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases, whenever used in this policy, shall have the meanings defined in this section unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

- (a) "Cannabis" has the meaning set forth in California Business and Professions Code Section 26001, as that section may be amended from time to time.
- (b) "Electronic Smoking Device" means an electronic device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or vaporized substance to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, vape pen, or e-hookah.
- (c) "Enclosed area" means all space between a floor and a ceiling that is bounded by walls, doorways, or windows, whether open or closed, covering more than 50 percent of the combined surface area of the vertical planes constituting the perimeter of the area. A wall includes any retractable divider or other physical barrier, whether temporary or permanent.
- (d) "Redwood Acres Fairgrounds" means all enclosed and unenclosed space that comprise the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds.
- (e) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted, heated, or ignited cigar, cigarette, or pipe, or any other lighted, heated, or activated tobacco, nicotine, or plant product intended for inhalation, including hookah and cannabis, whether natural or synthetic. "Smoking" also means using an electronic smoking device.
- (f) "Temporary Cannabis Event" means an event that has been issued a temporary cannabis event license by the Bureau of Cannabis Control pursuant to California Business and Professional Code Section 26200(e).
- (g) "Tobacco Product" means:
 - (1) any product containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by any other means, including but not limited to, a cigarette, a cigar, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus;
 - (2) any electronic smoking device as defined in this policy and any substances that may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine; or
 - (3) any component, part, accessory, of (1) or (2), whether or not any of these contains tobacco or nicotine, including but not limited to filters, rolling papers, blunt or hemp wraps, hookahs, and pipes.

"Tobacco Product" does not mean drugs, devices, or combination products authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, as those terms are defined in the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

- (h) "Tobacco use" means smoking, chewing, absorbing, dissolving or ingesting of any tobacco product.
- (i) "Unenclosed area" means any area that is not an enclosed area.
- (j) "Youth-Oriented Facility" means a parcel in Humboldt County that is occupied by:
 - (1) a private or public kindergarten, elementary, middle, junior high, or high school;
 - (2) a library open to the public;
 - (3) a playground open to the public;
 - (4) a park open to the public or to all the residents of a private community; or
 - (5) a licensed child-care facility or preschool other than a small-family day care home or a large-family day care home as defined in California Health & Safety Code Section 1596.78.

SMOKING PROHIBITED.

- (a) Smoking and tobacco use is prohibited in the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds, other than in a designated smoking area.
- (b) Smoking and tobacco use is prohibited within 25 feet of the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds.
- (c) At least one clear, conspicuous and unambiguous "No Smoking, Tobacco Use, or E-Cigarettes" sign shall be posted at each entrance to the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds, and in other conspicuous points throughout the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds. Notwithstanding this provision, the presence or absence of signs shall not be a defense to a charge of smoking in violation of this policy.

DESIGNATED SMOKING AREAS.

Designated smoking areas may be established in the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds that must:

- (a) Be an unenclosed area;
- (b) Be located at least twenty-five (25) feet from any enclosed area;
- (c) Be located at least twenty-five (25) feet from unenclosed areas primarily used by children;
- (d) Have a clearly marked perimeter;
- (e) Be identified by conspicuous signs; and

- (f) Not permit cannabis smoking, which is only permitted in separate, designated cannabis consumption areas.

EXCEPTION FOR TEMPORARY CANNABIS EVENTS.

Notwithstanding the general prohibition on smoking, cannabis smoking is permitted in the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds for a temporary cannabis event, but only in designated cannabis consumption areas that must:

- (a) Be unenclosed areas;
- (b) Restrict access to persons 21 years of age or older;
- (c) Not be visible from any public place or non-age-restricted area;
- (d) Not be within 500 feet of a youth-oriented facility; and
- (e) Not allow alcohol consumption or tobacco use.

PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.

- (a) Each instance of smoking or tobacco use in violation of this policy shall constitute a separate violation.
- (b) A first violation of this policy will result in the person in violation being asked to refrain from smoking, and to extinguish, turn off, or put away the tobacco, cannabis, or plant product.
- (c) A second violation of this policy will result in the person in violation being asked to leave the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds.
- (d) Upon a third violation of this policy, the person in violation will be asked to leave the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds and [will receive a ban on returning within 12 months].

REDWOOD ACRES FAIRGROUNDS
TOBACCO-FREE POLICY

Option 3 100% tobacco and cannabis smoke-free (with edible exemption)

DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases, whenever used in this policy, shall have the meanings defined in this section unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

- (a) "Cannabis" has the meaning set forth in California Business and Professions Code Section 26001, as that section may be amended from time to time.
- (b) "Electronic Smoking Device" means an electronic device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or vaporized substance to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, vape pen, or e-hookah.
- (c) "Enclosed area" means all space between a floor and a ceiling that is bounded by walls, doorways, or windows, whether open or closed, covering more than 50 percent of the combined surface area of the vertical planes constituting the perimeter of the area. A wall includes any retractable divider or other physical barrier, whether temporary or permanent.
- (d) "Redwood Acres Fairgrounds" means all enclosed and unenclosed space that comprise the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds.
- (e) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted, heated, or ignited cigar, cigarette, or pipe, or any other lighted, heated, or activated tobacco, nicotine, or plant product intended for inhalation, including hookah and cannabis, whether natural or synthetic. "Smoking" also means using an electronic smoking device.
- (f) "Temporary Cannabis Event" means an event that has been issued a temporary cannabis event license by the Bureau of Cannabis Control pursuant to California Business and Professional Code Section 26200(e).

- (c) At least one clear, conspicuous and unambiguous "No Smoking, Tobacco Use, or E-Cigarettes" sign shall be posted at each entrance to the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds, and in other conspicuous points throughout the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds. Notwithstanding this provision, the presence or absence of signs shall not be a defense to a charge of smoking in violation of this policy.

TEMPORARY CANNABIS EVENTS.

During any temporary cannabis event, cannabis consumption that does not involve smoking is permitted, but only in designated cannabis consumption areas that must:

- (a) Be unenclosed areas;
- (b) Restrict access to persons 21 years of age or older;
- (c) Not be visible from any public place or non-age-restricted area;

(d) Not be within 1,000 feet of a youth-oriented facility; and

(e) Not allow alcohol consumption or tobacco use.

PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.

(a) Each instance of smoking or tobacco use in violation of this policy shall constitute a separate violation.

(b) A first violation of this policy will result in the person in violation being asked to refrain from smoking, and to extinguish, turn off, or put away the tobacco, cannabis, or plant product.

(c) A second violation of this policy will result in the person in violation being asked to leave the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds.

(d) Upon a third violation of this policy, the person in violation will be asked to leave the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds and [will receive a ban on returning within 12 months].

Option 2 100% Smoke-Free with exemption for Special Cannabis Events

- (c) "Enclosed area" means all space between a floor and a ceiling that is bounded by walls, doorways, or windows, whether open or closed, covering more than 50 percent of the combined surface area of the vertical planes constituting the perimeter of the area. A wall includes any retractable divider or other physical barrier, whether temporary or permanent.

PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.

(a) Each instance of smoking or tobacco use in violation of this policy shall constitute a separate violation.

(b) A first violation of this policy will result in the person in violation being asked to refrain from smoking, and to extinguish, turn off, or put away the tobacco, cannabis, or plant product.

(c) A second violation of this policy will result in the person in violation being asked to leave the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds.

(d) Upon a third violation of this policy, the person in violation will be asked to leave the Redwood Acres Fairgrounds and [will receive a ban on returning within 12 months].
